Still to come is this year's supply of paper, stamps and envelopes for the newsletter. With the mailing list expected to reach 80 a month by the summer, it's the club's largest expense. Lyne told the exec that while the club is financially healthy, there's not much room for extras.

In other business, we're still planning a bulk purchase from England later this year and Andre Lalonde is putting together a list. He's looking for those large, expensive, hard-to-get items not readily available from local suppliers. Things like galvanized frames, Series I bulkheads, bodyparts, overdrives and canvas tops.
