The exec is recommending a dues boost to \$15 which should cover newsletter costs for several years. The one-time initiation charge for new members will remain at \$5. Treasurer Tom will have full details at the AGM in January. (Prez Robin, in his attached tome, refers to members having a look at Treasurer Tom's figures. Editor McD apologizes to members and the prez alike but there's just not enough room in this newsletter. Catch it at the AGM in January.)

Think cream of broccoli soup or salad, roast pork or turkey, whipped potatoes, green beans and turnips. Remember special Land Rover cake and hot coffee. Concentrate on freebies, prizes, the Lugnut Award. Recall the slide show, videotapes and photos of this year's events and misadventures. Obviously, we're talking about the Christmas party Saturday, Dec 8 at the Coffee Lodge resturant, 2450 Lancaster Rd., near the Museum of Science and Technology off St Laurent Boulevard. Cliff and Bobby Cochrane of Atlantic British Canada have donated \$90 in gift certificates for prizes. We'll have cocktails at 6:30 and put on the feedbag around 7p.m. Your price for the evening is \$17 each, up two bucks from last year. The club is being charged \$22 for the meal, rental of the premises and gratuity. The difference is being picked up from OVLR coffers. Merry Christmas. The phone committee will be calling so please make your plans to attend now.

We have received only seven nomination forms for this year's election of new officers. Four were submitted by existing executive members and one from the editor, leaving only two from the members at large. Deadline for nominations is Nov 30. After that, the Elections Officers will ask those nominated if they will run for office and, if so, the December newsletter will carry their names and a ballot. Members may vote by returning their ballot by mail or voting in person at the annual general meeting Jan 9, 1990.

The Association of Land Rover Owners of Canada (ALROC) is till alive and kicking. So says President Harold Huggins from headquarte in White Rock, British Columbia. While only eight members attended the inqual meeting last month, Harold says sufficient enthusiasm existed to continue the national organization. While there were no plans to result Transfer Box, the association's official magazine which folded earlied this year for lack of funds, Harold says: "Something will be published in ALROC's status before year's end."

The Canadian Series One Cluo, an organization dedicated to the preservation and restoration of pre-1958 Land Rovers, has emerged to save some of the "best and the brave" from the scrap heap. Founded by Dave Davey and Nancy Bell of Norwood, Ont., the organization hopes to evolve into something that offers parts, support and expertise on Series 1-80, 86, 88, 107 and 109 inch models. The earliest "flatside" Land Rover believed sold in Canada was the 1950-80 inch wheelbase. Dave, a veteran OVLR member, has already located several of Leyland's early versions. Nancy is rebuilding a 1955-86. At least five other Series Ones reside within OVLR's ranks, including the Dowell brothers mint 86 that won top restoration award at this summer's Atlantic British rally. The organization is looking for decrepit Series Ones in need of a place to hide from the scrap dealers. It will assist in getting sellers and buyers in touch with each other, hopes to stock some spares and perhaps hold worksnops and arrange bulk purchases from Mother England. WHO ARE WE ?
